Cameras for Girls Update

In the April 2022 issue of *Photoshop User*, we interviewed Amina Mohamed, a Canadian-based photographer who

started the **Cameras for Girls** program in Uganda in 2018 to help marginalized females. The program provides each girl with a camera they can keep, along with skills-based training to help them get jobs. During the three-day workshop in Uganda, the students learn how to operate the camera and to tell stories using the camera as a tool. Unfortunately, COVID temporarily halted the live training provided by Cameras for Girls; however, we were happy to learn that they were able to return to Uganda this past June to train 15 young women. According to Amina, not only did the training go very well, but they were able to do four days this year. The first three days were the standard workshop, where the girls learned how to use the cameras and tell stories with their photography. On the fourth day, they worked with a Ugandan-based NGO called **Concern for the Girl Child**, where the girls got to put their training to use by researching and telling a story about the organization.

Cameras for Girls also purchased two new computers for the editing lab in Uganda. Along with access to KelbyOne, plus training partners such as Kenny Mulinde, a filmmaker, and Tendo Racheal, a content creator, the girls are learning editing, captioning, and social media 101. Currently, Cameras for Girls is hard at work trying to expand their training to other areas, such as South Africa and Tanzania. The more females they can train, the greater their voices will reach. A large portion of the charity's work, aside from providing the girls with cameras and access to computers for editing, comes from donations and partnerships with other photographers and companies such as KelbyOne and recently Canon and LensPen.
